#### HQ ARPC provides resources for retirees applying for retirement pay

On Wed, Oct 23, 2019 at 11:17 AM ARPC/PA <<u>arpc.pa@us.af.mil</u>> wrote: During fiscal year 2019, HQ Air Reserve Personnel Center located at Buckley AFB, Colo. processed over 10,000 retirement orders for Guard and Reserve members. Over that time, HQ ARPC has made great strides in improving customer service by reducing processing time for retirement orders to be submitted for pay and educating the retiree population on the application process.

We have had success in educating the community surrounding Buckley AFB through the local Retiree Activities Office so we want to build upon that success and spread our message worldwide to reach as many retired members as possible. Our public website has a page devoted to retirements, <u>https://www.arpc.afrc.af.mil/retirement/</u>, with links and information for all types of retiree statuses. There are instructions on how to apply for retirement pay, videos to help navigate the application process, and graphics, like the one attached, that explains the process.

The website is also updated monthly with the current processing status to let the applicant know when they should expect their retirement order. For example, as of Oct 2 applications for retired pay were being processed for members turning 60 in the months of October and November. The current workflow status will be updated the first Monday of each month.

The first step for everyone approaching a reduced retirement pay age (RRPA) or age 60 is to visit myPers and create an account. After navigating to the retirement application page, the retiree will be able to submit the DD Form 2656 through the automated system. This automated system ensures all applications are submitted correctly and completely, preventing any unnecessary additional processing time. Once the application is processed, the retiree will receive a retirement order they can use to apply for Tricare. The retirement order will also be sent to DFAS to start the pay process, which could take an additional 30 days, according to their website.

HQ ARPC has made it a priority to create a website that can be used as a resource for you and the retiree population. As we continue to update our customer support processes and our website, we will continue to communicate with all RAOs.

Medical benefits depend upon a current identification card and current address information in DEERS. The quickest way to update your address, phone number, or e-mail address is through the DEERS Web site at <u>www.dmdc.osd.mil</u>, then select "DOD Community", then select "Personnel Services". You may call (800) 538-9552 between 0900 and 1800 Eastern Time, Wednesday through Friday. You should do this every time you move, even temporarily (pay attention "snow birds").

## PERMANENT ID CARDS FOR 75+ SPOUSES:

♦ Spouses of military retirees that are 75 years old can now get permanent dependent ID cards (If your current card is within 90 days of expiring) This can be done by mail through the 934th AW Customer Service. Call that office for instructions on mail procedures at (612) 713-1085. (Takes about 30 days to process)

♦ Another option – Sponsor can bring a 3 X 4 or larger Recent Photo of their dependent spouse if spouse cannot physically come with.

### TRICARE Goes Digital:

◆ TRICARE for Life (TFL) beneficiaries will soon be able to print a copy of their Explanation of Benefits (EOB) from the convenience of their own homes. Starting this month, the only paper EOB's that TFL beneficiaries living in the United States and U.S. territories will receive will be monthly summaries. In February, beneficiaries will have the option to receive an electronic notification every time a claim processes by logging on to the secure website at <u>www.TRICARE4U.com</u> to view and print their EOB. ♦ <u>Annuitants (Surviving spouses receiving SBP or RSFPP payments)</u>: Notify Defense Finance and Accounting Service, US Military Annuitant Pay, PO Box 7131, London, KY 40742-7131. Include retired grade and Social Security number of your sponsor, your Social Security number, and signature. This is the only agency that can change addresses of annuitants. Phone (800) 321-1080, FAX (800) 982-8459.

◆ <u>Gray Area Retirees (under 60 reserve & guard qualified</u>): Call Air Reserve Personnel Center (ARPC) in Denver (800) 525-0102 to change your address.
